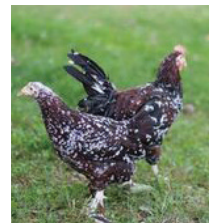


SPECKLED SUSSEX

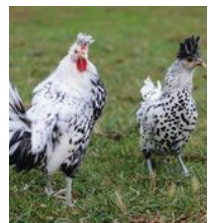

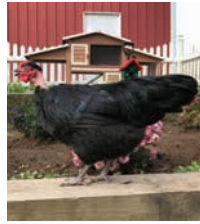


TURKENS

Mature weight: 2lbs - 3lbs.

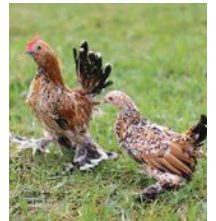

All 4 color varieties of cochins we offer have a gentle disposition, extremely fluffy feathers and five toes with feathered legs. They typically make great mothers.



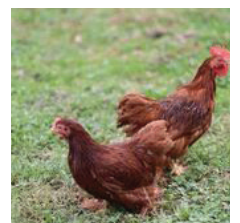

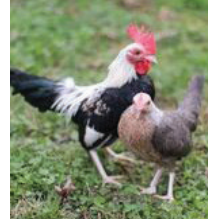
These feather legged beauties have a tail feather that stands straight up. They have a slate blue coloring to the feathers that give off a luminous sparkle to match their dazzling personalities.

INDIAN RUNNER

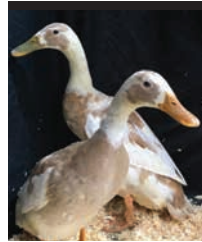

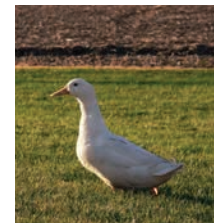

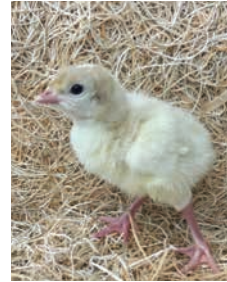
TURKEYS, GUINEAS, PEAFOWL

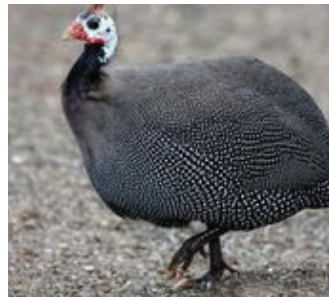

GUINEAS

Mature weight: 5lbs - 7lbs.

While they may look strange, guineas are some of the best watch dogs available, always alerting you when something is out of the ordinary. These birds are excellent foragers and can help keep bug populations down. Their moist, dark meat also makes a delicious meal.



PEACOCK

(LIMITED QUANTITY)

Nothing tops the majestic look of a mature peacock! We carry both white and blue varieties but quantities are extremely limited so be sure to place your orders early!

CHICK CARE GUIDE

Regardless of the breed, always make sure your pens are clean and dry! We recommend using medium (flake) shavings. Before your new hatchlings arrive, check to make sure your brooder or heat lamp(s) are creating the appropriate temperature by checking it with a thermometer! To avoid overheating, make sure you have adequate space for the birds to escape the heat as well. When your hatchlings arrive they will need water first and foremost. Dip their beaks in clean, room temperature water to get them acclimated and hydrated before giving them food.

CHICKENS

Broiler chicks (meat birds) need to be away from food for 10 hours a day once they are two weeks and older. If their food is not taken away they will overeat which can lead to heart attacks at an early age. Layer chicks, unlike broiler chicks, can have unrestricted access to their feed.

PEACOCKS

Peafowl require extra care! They need high temperatures and a feed very high in protein, like turkey starter, from day one. We give our peafowl hard boiled eggs for the first two weeks in addition to a high protein feed to ensure proper growth.

DUCKS

Ducks are messy! It's best not to co-mingle them with other poultry. They like to splash and play in the water while chicks, guineas, turkeys, pheasants, and peafowl don't like being wet!

TURKEYS

Never let your turkeys get wet or cold and always make sure they have a heat source available. Turkeys need a feed very high in protein to ensure proper growth.
